RECYCLED WRAPPER PRODUCTS

By using traditional weaving practices, discarded wrappers are

transformed into beautiful purses & wallets. The wrappers are collected, sorted, cleaned, cut, woven & sewn together.

There are 200 to 400 packet strips in each finished wallet
